INTRODUCTION

With an objective of providing quality education to economically and socially backward sections of the people in surrounding regions, Mulki Sunder Ram Shetty College was founded in 1980. The College is managed by Vidyavarhdaka Sangha ®, Shirva which also runs other educational institutions in and around Shirva. The Sangha has been rendering valuable service in the field of education for more than six decades.

Mulki Sunder Ram Shetty College is affiliated to Mangalore University. The College is a grant-in-aid institution and has permanent affiliation. It is recognized by the UGC under 2(f) and 12(B). The college is accredited by the NAAC with 'B' Grade

The College offers degree courses in Arts and Commerce. In the current academic year B.B.M. degree course has been introduced. The students are also offered courses in computer education. The College has good infrastructure consisting of lecture halls, auditorium, separate library block, "Kreeda Bhavan", newly constructed ladies hostel, vast play ground and a campus sprawling over 27 acres of land.

The College has made good progress during the last 28 years in both curricular and co-curricular activities. Apart from consistently good academic results, the achievement of the College has been making

quality education accessible to weaker sections of the society at the lowest cost possible. This is appreciated by the peer team of the NAAC in its Report (2006) in the following words: “Mulki Sunder Ram Shetty College founded by Vidyavardhaka Sangha with a great concern for the benefit of the deprived, has emerged as an important institution in the region for the education of the rural youth”.

#### PART -A

The IQAC of the College met in the month April 2008 in the College Auditorium. After reviewing the activities of the previous academic year, a plan of action was chalked out for the academic year 2008-09. The quality enhancement initiatives and programmes set forth were as follows:

1. Taking in to consideration, the growing demand for management programmes, it was decided to start B.B.M. degree course in the academic year 2008-09 with necessary infrastructural facilities.
2. To complete the construction work of Women’s Hostel and to ensure that the hostel becomes functional within a year.
3. To explore the possibility of establishing a rural health centre in the college campus with the assistance of Nitte Education Trust.
4. To develop a website of the college and get in to the network system.

5. To focus on student-centric learning with emphasis on seminars, projects and computer assisted teaching.
6. To purchase a LCD projector for the College which can be used by the faculty in teaching and by the resource persons in training programmes conducted in the College.
7. To train the faculty in the adoption of computer assisted teaching methods.
8. To computerize library operations in a phased manner.
9. To conduct bridge courses and remedial classes in an effective manner.
10. To conduct training programmes in language enhancement and analytical skills and provide guidance to students appearing for campus recruitment tests.
11. To make effective use of the sports infrastructure through
  - training of students in sports and games.
  - Conduct of University level volley ball tournament for men and women.
  - Encouragement and training to outstanding sports persons.
12. Organising guest lectures and training programmes by resource persons from various fields to develop among the students :
  - Leadership skills and self confidence.
  - Legal health and environmental awareness and civic responsibility.

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- Value orientation and sense of service.
  - Knowledge and awareness regarding various current issues and developments.
13. Conduct various extra-curricular activities, cultural and literary competitions and provide opportunities to the students to express and develop their skills and talents.
  14. To organise various outreach programmes for the benefit of the society through the college NSS unit and through collaborations with NGOs.
  15. Provide opportunities to students to write poems, essays, stories and develop their creative skills through the wall magazine "Srujana".
  16. To involve actively the PTA and the Alumini Association in the programmes of the College.
  17. To identify the potential donors and seek their assistance for providing scholarships and other facilities to poor students.

#### PART- B

1. Activities reflecting the goals and objectives of the institution:
  - i. In accordance with the vision and mission, majority of the students admitted during the academic year 2008-09 are from socially and economically backward sections of the society.

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- ii. The gender ratio is in favour of the women, as majority of our students are women.
- iii. The College has admitted students irrespective of their academic performance. Students who have passed in attempts are also admitted.
- iv. The college collects lowest fees from the students . 90% of our students secure fee concessions or scholarships.
- v. Particular attention is paid to the difficulties faced by –
  - Girl students
  - Students belonging to SCs/STs and
  - Slow learners.
- vi. The college has a grievance redressal mechanism wherein the problems of students, relating to academic and non-academic matters are heard and redressed.
- vii. During this academic year, the college has conducted –
  - Personality development programmes.
  - Training in communication and analytical skills.
  - Bridge courses and remedial classes.
  - Lectures by eminent resource persons regarding conservation of the environment, health awareness, legal awareness, monument protection and career guidance.
- viii. Student Centric approach has been increasingly used by the faculty in the teaching having process.
- ix. Field visits to archaeological sites. A number of cultural and literary activities have been conducted to give opportunities to the students to develop their skills and talents.

- x. Outstanding students have been sent to take part in inter-collegiate literary and cultural competitions. Some of them bagged prizes and brought laurels to the college.
- xi. A number of extension and outreach programmes have been conducted through NSS unit, community Development Cell and Youth Red Cross Unit of the College.
- xii. University Level volleyball Tournament for Men and Women was conducted.
- xiii. The excellent sports infrastructure has been efficiently used by providing training to students in sports and games.
- xiv. Outstanding sports persons are trained and sent to take part in inter collegiate competitions. The college volley ball and cricket team had taken part in a number of inter-university competitions. The poems, essays and articles written by students are published in the wall magazine "Srujana" and the Annual magazine of the college.
- xv. The new BBM degree course has been started with an intake of 60 students.
- xvi. The new Women's Hostel Building has been completed and is ready for occupancy from the next academic year.
- xvii. The college has developed a website <http://www.msrscollege.org> giving information regarding the profile of the institution, management, admission process, fee structure, courses offered, results and scholarships available to students.

xviii. The college has maintained the tradition of maintaining good results in the University Examinations.

xix. The members of the faculty have taken part in a number of workshops seminars and training programmes to upgrade their skills and keep pace with recent developments in various fields.

2. New academic programmes initiated (UG and PG)

The B.B.M. degree course has been introduced from this academic year. 60 students have been admitted to this programme.

3. Innovations in curricular design and transaction:

Our College is affiliated to Mangalore University and we follow the curriculum designed by the University.

4. Inter-disciplinary programmes started:

'Indian Constitution', 'Human Rights, Gender Equity and Environment' are offered as inter disciplinary subjects to I and II semester B.A., B.Com. and B.B.M. students. "General Studies" and "Human Resource Development" are offered as inter disciplinary subjects to III semester and IV semester B.A. students respectively.

5. Examination reforms implemented:

In each semester, a class test and examination is conducted to assess students performance and award internal assessment marks.

Under the credit based semester system, the participation and performance of the students are also included for the award of grades.

The academic performance of the students is monitored by the respective class teachers. Remedial classes are conducted for slow learners. Advanced learners are motivated and guided to achieve academic excellence.

18. Community services :

The N.S.S. unit, the Community Development Cell and the Youth Red Cross units of the College have organised a number of extension and outreach programmes for the benefit of the Community.

The NS.S. unit of the college has conducted various community service activities in association with NGOs and service organizations in and around Shirva.

The Annual Special Camp of the N.S.S. was held at Sri S.V.H. Pre-University College, Innanje. The projects under taken

were leveling of the school play ground and cleaning the surroundings. A number of educational and cultural programmes were conducted for the benefit of the students and public. All these activities were greatly appreciated by the school administration and local people.

A blood donation camp was organised in the College in association with Rotary Club, Shirva and Blood Bank of Udupi district. 48 students and staff members donated blood.

A “Free Dental Camp” was organised in association with A.B. Shetty Institute of Dental Sciences, Mangalore. 175 people under went free check up and treatment in the camp.

The N.S.S. unit has also conducted a number of useful activities for the benefit of the students and the community at large. Important among them are:

- Tree plantation and awareness programmes on environment protection and plastic eradication.
- Health awareness programmes.
- Legal awareness programme.
- Personality development and leadership development programmes.

The Community Development Cell and the Youth Red Cross unit of our College conducted a programme on “Contagious diseases and their prevention and Cure” and a programme on lead awareness for the benefit of the students and the public.

21. Improvements in the Library services :

Internet facility is available to the staff and students in the library. The process of computerization of library services is under process.

22. New books/journals subscribed and their value :

The College has a well furnished library with 11,127 volumes costing over Rs. 7,60,000.00. During 2008-09, 768 books valued at Rs. 72,848.00 have been added. The library subscribes to 22 magazines and journals.

23. Course in which Student-assessment of teachers is introduced and the action is taken on the student feedback:

Every teacher prepares a self evaluation report at the end of the academic year which is submitted to the head of the institution Besides, the teachers are evaluated by students of B.A., B.Com. and B.B.M. programmes. A structured questionnaire is provided to students and the feed back is analysed and the results are communicated to the concerned teachers. The teachers are asked by the head of the institution to work on their areas of weak performance.

25. Computerization of administration and the process of admissions and examination results, issue of certificates:

The administration process is partially computerized. The declaration of examination results and the issue of certificates are done by the University.

26. Increase in the infrastructural facilities:

- Women's Hostel at a cost of Rs. 62 lakhs has been constructed and is ready for occupation from the coming academic year.
- Separate classrooms with furnitures have been provided for B.B.M. degree programmes.
- Two Bathrooms and eight toilets have been added to the ladies waiting room of the College.
- The College canteen building has been renovated.
- Additional book bank facility has been provided by Canara Bank.

27. Technology up gradation :

- A computer and scanner has been installed in the college office.
- A fax machine has been installed in Principals Chamber.
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28. Computer and Internet access and training teachers and students:

Computer facility and internet access are provided to students and staff. Members of the faculty are given training in computer assisted teaching methods. Students are trained in the computer centre of the college.

## 29. Financial aid to students :

During this academic year the college has extended the following financial assistance. A number of scholarships and fee concessions are provided to students. - Vinod and Dr. Chandrashekar Shetty Kaup Foundation has instituted 50 scholarships of Rs. 1000.00 each which are awarded to but economically poor students.
- Three staff members have instituted 6 scholarships in memory of their late parents.

30. Activities and support from the Alumni Association :

The old students Association has been taking keen interest in the activities of the College. A number of sports and cultural events held in the College had been co-sponsored by the Alumini Association.

31. Activities and support from the Parent-Teacher Association :

The meetings of the Parent-Teacher Association are conducted regularly and there is close interaction between the faculty and the parents of students. The parents are informed of various activities of the College and the academic performance and programmes of their children. The members of the PTA have extended full support to our endeavors.

32. Health Services :

Annual Medical Examination is mandatory for students. The students are provided with timely medical treatment whenever they develop health related complications and sickness in the College. Qualified doctors and professionals in the medical field are invited to the College to deliver lecturer on health care, communicable diseases and preventive measures for the benefit of students. Particular attention is paid to the health problems of girl students. Senior lady faculty advise and provide guidance to girl students hygiene and health care.

33. Performance in sports activities:

The College has excellent sports infrastructure consisting of vast playground, a separate Kreedha Bhavan with Multi-Gym and facilities for indoor games.

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Regular and special coaching are provided to students to improve their skills.

Our Womens Volley Ball Team was declared runners in the Udupi District Dasara Sports Festival conducted in Udupi and in M.S.R.S. Memorial Volley Ball tournament held in our College and in University Level Floodlit tournament held in PPC, Udupi.

Kum. Nivedita, III B.A. has been selected to represent Mangalore University Volley Ball Team in the preliminary camp held at Mangalore University.

#### 34. Incentives to outstanding sportspersons:

Intensive coaching is provided to outstanding sports persons to improve their performance. Financial assistance is extended to them by the management and the faculty in times of need. Achievements of sports persons are well recognized and rewarded.

#### 35. Students achievements and awards :

Our students have excelled in curricular, co-curricular activities:

- i) Our Final B.A. students have secured a pass percentage of 95.91 with 8 distinctions and 18 first classes in the University Examinations held in April/may 2008. The result of the Final Year B.Com. is 70.68 with 5 distinctions and 16 first classes.

- ii) Kum. Sandhya Shenoy, III B.A. presented a paper on the writings of Dr. Shivarama Karanth at Sharada Maha Vidyalaya, Mangalore. She presented her poems in Youth Poets Fest held at Govinda Pai Research Centre, Udupi. She also presented a paper on the novels of Dr. Na Mogasale at Udupi district Yuva Sahitya Sammelana 2009.
- iii) Manoj Kumar, III B.A. represented Mangalore University in the National Integration Camp held at Jaipur (Rajasthan) from 18<sup>th</sup> June to 24<sup>th</sup> June 2008.
- iv) Chandrashekar, III B.A., Manjappa, III B.Com. Manoj, III B.A. and Suneetha, III B.A. participated in the South Zone Interstate NSS Camp held at Mangalagangothri, Konaje in 2008.
- v) Manoj Kumar and Suneetha took part National Integration Youth Camp organised by National Youth project at Bangalore in 2008.

36. Activities of the Guidance and Counseling unit :

The Guidance and Counselling Cell headed by the Student Welfare Officer. The genuine grievances and problems of the students are heard and efforts are made to redress them. The students can convey their grievances to the respective class teachers or to the Student Welfare Officer. The collective problems and major issues are discussed in the Student Council meetings. Every effort is made to sort out the inconvenience of students and to maintain cordial relations between the staff and students. Wherever necessary personal guidance and counselling is provided to students with respect to academic and other matters.

37. Placement services provided to students :

Training is imparted to students of Final year degree classes in “Analytical and Language Enhancement Skills” by the faculty and resource persons from outside. Brain storming exercises and group discussions are conducted for the benefit of students. Necessary guidance is provided to students while appearing for campus recruitment tests and interviews. Students are also provided with information on career opportunities available to them.

38. Development programmes for non-teaching staff :

The Office superintendent and two non-teaching staff members attended a workshop on “Quality Enhancement in Administration in Colleges” held at Milagres College, Kallianpur.

39. Healthy practices of the institution :

- Use of cell phones in the College is prohibited.
- The students adhere to the College dress code.
- There has been no single incidence of student unrest during this academic year.
- Student-monitoring system has been introduced.
- Faculty and the students participated enthusiastically in the “anti-terrorism awareness programme” initiated by the State Govt.
- There has been no wasteful expenditures by students during student council elections. Money, thus saved was donated to the College.

- Through out the academic year the students actively took part in outreach programmes and community service activities.

1. The construction work of Women's Hostel has been completed at a cost of Rs. 65 lakhs financed by the UGC. The Hostel Building was inaugurated by Sri. N.R. Shetty, former Vice Chancellor, Bangalore University on 6<sup>th</sup> April 2009. With 70% of students being women, it was our long felt need to have an Women's Hostel in the campus. The new hostel which is going to be operational from the next academic year will be of great benefit to girl students from surrounding regions.
2. The newly started B.B.M. programme has completed the first successful year. It was intended to met the growing demand for management education from students belonging to this rural regions. But for this programme, it would have been difficult for them to persue management course else where because of their poor financial position.

### PART - C

The IQAC of the College, met on 28.4.2009 and chalked out a number of quality enhancement and sustenance inetiatives for the academic year 2009-10.

1. To conduct class-wise orientation to students in the beginning of the academic year. The object is to inform the students about various facilities available in the College and motivate them for better performance in academic and extra-curricular activities.
2. To make teaching learning process more student centric with active participation of students in class room discussions and presentation of seminars by them on a regular basis.
3. More increasing use of computer assisted teaching and learning methods.
4. To create necessary infrastructure for the use of L.C.D. projector and power point presentations by faculty and students.
5. To conduct training programmes for the staff in the use of computers, internet and audio visual aids.
6. The faculty should take up minor research projects funded by the U.G.C.
7. To conduct University / State Level Seminars and workshops funded by the U.G.C.
8. To provide necessary accessories to the newly constructed Women's Hostel and make it functional in the coming academic year.



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9. To provide required infrastructural facilities for the newly started B.B.M programme.
10. To complete the process of partial computerization of library services.
11. To evolve effective training programmes in analytical and communication skills to help the students in campus recruitment tests and provide them guidance with respect to higher studies and career opportunities available.
12. To conduct more extra-curricular activities to help the students and the society.
